

FROM THE BOARD

Happy New Year! We're hoping that 2022 will be a better year for all. We are blessed to live in a beautiful place. Hopefully we can enjoy every day in good health.

The last Board Meeting was held on December 18, 2021. Following are some of the highlights of that meeting. *For additional details, see the meeting minutes from Board Secretary Barb Jamerson.

Five Board members were present at the meeting, three in person and two via conference call. Quorum was met. Seven home-owners were present in person and six were present via conference call. The minutes of the previous meeting, October 16, 2021 were approved. Ramona Widick, treasurer, reported that as of December 18, 2021 we have \$54,325.67 in our Checking Account and \$139,103.31 in our Reserve Account. All dues are paid through November 30, 2021, and all submitted bills have been paid to date. Ramona also reported that the Sanitation Department contacted her regarding specific information on the pipes used for sanitation and

water, which she is following up on. President Neal Kania welcomed everyone to the meeting. He reported that he received a letter from our insurance company regarding our 10-20 year risk management projection practices. Neal discussed our "ladder approach" to maintaining the buildings and related costs and how it relates to property owners' monthly fees in the future. In Old Business, the reroofing of Building H will be begin in the spring of 2022, and the budget for 2022 and the adjusted dock fees were approved. See the December 18 Board Meeting Minutes for the new fee schedule for watercraft.

Neal also reported on the Brandy Lake Association. They have planned a meeting to be held January 14th. Kevin Gauthier, a marine biologist, will speak at that meeting via Zoom. Further updates will be given at the next Brandy Condo Board meeting on Saturday, April 23, 2022

In New Business, the reroofing of Building A Garage is scheduled for completion in 2022.

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In the Owners' Open Forum several things were discussed: the feasibility of a spigot and a hose near the piers, the repair of the deck surrounding the Rec Center, and a reminder that only Board members are permitted to file claims with the insurance company. Neal also welcomed Barb Jamerson to the board as an appointed member due to the recent resignation of Gene Cole, Secretary.

The next Board meeting will be Saturday, April 23, 2022, 9:00 a.m. at the Rec Center. FYI: The Annual Board Meeting this year will be Saturday, July 16, 2022. *-Brandy Lake Property Association Board*







BRANDY BELLES BOOK CLUB - Nan Beer






